

What is Autism?

Autism is a **brain disorder** that affects a person's ability to communicate, to reason, and to interact with others. It is a **spectrum disorder** that affects individuals differently and to varying degrees of severity, and it is often found in combination with other disabilities.

How Common is Autism?

Autism is more common than childhood cancer, cystic fibrosis, and multiple sclerosis combined. It is also a lifelong disability.



What Causes Autism?

The cause for Autism remains unknown. Researchers believe there is a strong genetic component with a range of possible external or environmental triggers. However, it is clear that children with Autism are born with the disorder or the potential to develop it. Autism is NOT caused by bad parenting, and children with Autism are not unruly kids who choose to misbehave.

How is Autism Treated?

There is no cure for autism. Evidence shows that early intervention can result in positive outcomes and that those with autism respond well to a highly-structured, specialized education program tailored to their needs.

Because autism is a spectrum disorder, no one method alone is effective in treating the disorder. However, there are some treatments that may help reduce symptoms. These include: prescription medications and occupational, speech, and sensory therapies. Some families have also anecdotally reported benefits from vitamins and special diets.
